## LENTEN REGULATIONS

*Catholics join in a common observance of penance during Lent. We set aside days to exercise works of prayer, fasting and charity.*

**ABSTINENCE:** *Not eating meat.*

- *Is for all Catholics 14 years and older.*
- *Is required on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.*

**FASTING:** *Eating only one full meal a day and not eating between meals*

- *Is for all Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.*
- *Only one full meal, two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs.*
- *Is required on ASH WEDNESDAY & GOOD FRIDAY.*

**EXCEPTIONS:** *The obligation doesn't apply to those whose health would be affected seriously. People in doubt, consult a priest.*

## **Easter Triduum**



The "Easter Triduum", the sacred three days, from Holy Thursday evening to Easter Sunday are celebrated as one great feast, the solemn celebration of the Church year. The Triduum is a commemoration of Jesus' death and resurrection into new life. We celebrate what we believe: that Christ by dying destroyed our death and by rising he restored our life. The Triduum celebrates our participation as parish communities in God's saving action, as we pass from death to new life in Christ.
